### INTRODUCED BY CARL E. VENNE, CHAIRMAN APSAALOOKE (CROW) TRIBAL EXECUTIVE BRANCH

## JOINT ACTION RESOLUTION OF THE APSAALOOKE (CROW) TRIBAL LEGISLATURE AND THE APSAALOOKE (CROW) TRIBAL EXECUTIVE BRANCH ENTITLED:

"A RESOLUTION AMENDING JOINT ACTION RESOLUTION JAR06-13 BY INCREASING THE AUTHORITY OF THE CHAIRMAN AND THE AD HOC LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE TO BORROW UP TO \$2.3 MILLION INSTEAD OF \$1.8 MILLION ALREADY APPROVED TO BE USED BY THE APSAALOOKE (CROW) TRIBE TO COVER THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF BUILDING PHASE II. OF THE WATER AND WASTE WATER SYSTEM IN AND FOR THE COMMUNITY OF CROW AGENCY, MONTANA AND THE REMAINDER OF JAR06-13 TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT EXCEPT THE MINOR ADJUSTMENTS THAT NEED TO BE MADE SUCH AS THE ANNUAL LOAN REPAYMENT".

WHEREAS, phase I. of the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe's water and waste water project is substantially completed; however, there is a minor dispute as to the removal of a storm drain and pipe in southwest Crow Agency, Montana;

WHEREAS, the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe is now ready to undertake Phase II. of this project consisting of completion of the lagoon and its infrastructure a vital phase to this overall project, but it is in need of a contingency fund in an amount to be set forth below;

WHEREAS, Apsaalooke Water and Waste Water Authority and the ad hoc Legislative Infra Structure Committee would like to bid Phase II. of this project no later than December, 2008, as this is a slow time for potential construction contractors and this will in all probability (better than a 50% chance) result in a better price with lower costs for the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe;

WHEREAS, this additional loan authority of \$500,000.00 is a contingency or "just in case fund", and in all probability the Apsaalooke Water and Waste Water Authority will be able to supplement the funds it already has secured with grant funds from the Montana Coal Board, Montana Department of Transportation and other grant sources to totally fund Phase II. of this water and waste water project for Crow Agency, Montana, headquarters of the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe, and these additional funds will not have to be borrowed;

October, 2008 Regular Session JAR Increasing loan Authority Page 1 of 4 WHEREAS, it is best not to emphasis the negative but by way of explanation Phase II. was shorted in funding as the expected imminent threat grant funds of around \$400,000.00 were not secured and the grant from the Montana Department of Transportation of around \$250,000.00 were not secured but these funds are still being pursued;

WHEREAS, the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe's other funding sources such as the Rural Development, USDA, EPA and IHS still require that this project be sufficiently capitalized or funded, prior to committing their respective grant and loan funds and, therefore, to be safe or to insure that there is sufficient capital or funds to build Phase II. of this project the loan authorization should be increased by \$500,000.00 and capped at \$2.3 instead of \$1.8 million;

WHEREAS, the loan details to be worked out with the lender, USDA, are set forth in the loan documents, and USDA is willing to give due consideration to loaning these funds to the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe;

WHEREAS, if the funds are borrowed at the going interest rate (probably 4.25 %) and if this loan is repaid or amortized over a fifteen (15) year period the annual payment will be increased somewhat from the initial amount of \$156,000.00 nd if the Apsaalooke (Crow) doesn't need to utilize the entire authorization of \$2.3 and hopefully it will not in borrowing capacity the annual loan payment will be less, and the principal and interest will be paid from the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe's gasoline tax revenue;

WHEREAS, USDA, the lender, still requires that a source of unencumbered tribal income be used as collateral for the loan, and the borrower, Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe, agrees to collateralize this loan with the unencumbered tribal income derived from the gasoline tax revenue, and this collateral will only be called upon in the event payment cannot and is not made;

WHEREAS, the State of Montana and the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe share the gasoline tax revenue and this sharing is based upon a Fuel Tax Cooperative Agreement, dated the November 8, 2000, as amended;

WHEREAS, the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe will use part of the revenue it derives from the Fuel Tax Cooperative Agreement with the State of Montana to make the annual loan payment to Rural Development, USDA, in an increased amount from the initial figure of \$156,000.00 or whatever annual payment is due depending upon the amount of the loan until said loan has been paid in full as stated above and foregoing;

WHEREAS, the lender has requested that in the event the unencumbered tribal funds derived from the sharing of the gasoline tax revenue have to be called upon for repayment of the loan that the State of Montana make direct payment to the lender, USDA, provided however that a modification must be made to the Fuel Tax Cooperative Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe by and through its law making branch or body, the Apsaalooke (Crow) Legislature, and the law enforcing branch or body, Executive, agreed to this modification or amendment to this Fuel Tax Cooperative Agreement

October, 2008 Regular Session JAR Increasing Ioan Authority Page 2 of 4 WHEREAS, not all of JAR06-13 is being amended but only certain provisions or parts and those that are not specifically amended shall remain in full, force and effect.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE AND THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE APSAALOOKE (CROW) TRIBE:

1. The Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribal Chairman is hereby granted authority to borrow up to \$2.3 million dollars subject to review and approval by the affirmative vote of the ad hoc Legislative Water/Sewer Construction Committee from the United States Department of Agriculture, USDA, and the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribal Chairman shall borrow at a rate of interest most advantageous to the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe and also work out a repayment schedule or time period most advantageous to the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to sign on behalf of the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe all necessary loan documents consisting of a promissory note, security agreement and the other documents evidencing the loan and the indebtedness;

2. Further, that the above referred to loan shall be amortized and repaid over a period of time most advantageous to the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe but no longer than a fifteen (15) years period, with revenue from the Apsaalooke (Crow) Tribe's share of the fuel tax revenue being allocated to the repayment of this loan;

3. Further, that the fuel tax revenue being unencumbered tribal income shall be used as collateral for the loan, and the Fuel Tax Cooperative Agreement with the State of Montana shall be amended accordingly; and,

4. Funds to build this project being derived from various grant and loan sources shall be properly accounted for within the Tribe's accounting system and programmed and budgeted in accordance with the Tribe's budgetary process.

5. Those provisions or parts of JAR06-13 not specifically amended shall remain in full, force and effect.
